In our literacy learning we had some great success with our spelling. We had a focus on certain sounds, practised them during the week and had proved our learning with a spelling test at the end of the week.





Tua Marina School


We are reaching out to invite you to consider joining our School Board of Trustees – a vital leadership group that helps shape the future of our school community.
