Year 4 - 5 || Julian Mason


Kia ora e te whānau,

Another couple of weeks of learning flies by. We have been working hard and making great use of our learning time. We have been utilising our multiplication and division skills to look closer at fractions for maths.



Bridge Valley Holiday Camps


