



It is now Rewarewas' turn to be involved in Kids Edible Gardens' (KEGs) and they are full of enthusiasm!

Our main aim for weeks 2 and 3 have been to empty the finished compost and tidy the gardens up and the class have been very industrious!!

The compost has now been emptied pot and bucket at a time and there was an exciting discovery along the way (a garden gecko -or maybe more than one)!

We are removing some of the old herbs and transplanting others into the sensory garden area and the Rewarewa team are keen to do the tough jobs as much as possible!

Some of the broadbeans have been removed to add to the compost and others are continuing in their growth so that we can eat the beans in future. We have also planted Sugarsnap peas and garlic so await their shoots appearing above the soil and being able to taste them in a few months time.
