

It was great to see all the creations on Pet Day! Congratulations to those who went through to Group Day and on to the A & P Show this weekend!


Our next PTA Meeting will be on Tuesday 11th November 7.30pm, venue TBC.

Library books can be returned to the library most mornings, as well as during class visits.



Rids Edible Gardens Term 4 2025!!

Wow it is term 4, and we are right into it!

This term it is the turm of the year 6s for KEGs and it is so nice to be out in the Spring sun with growth all around us!

In week 2 we concentrated on weeding and what are weeds. Although I had done a bit the week before there were plenty of weeds to carefully remove from around the plants and they keep growing!! We had a selection of weeds to identify and most were new to the students but it was great to see they knew buttercup and a few others and did remember some of the funny names for week 3.



We planted out some vegetable seedlings - cabbage, broccoli, kale and lettuce and our new Pear tree donated by Grey Floral. Special mention to William and George who have done much of the digging and planted the Olive trees that have been sitting on the deck outside the staff room for so long. These trees now have a home that will hopefully allow them to flourish and provide us with some lovely shade in the sensory garden!





We had a bit of a crazy week but hopefully those that planted some microgreens and pumpkin seeds in egg cartons will be able to bring them home soon to watch them grow and add to your lunches!

Tomatos or pumpkins planted into buckets will also be coming home to water and watch them grow and produce over the summer!

We hope that everyone will respect the mounding and progress on the garden (māra kūmara) as plenty of mahi has already gone into the process from the students and our advisor from Te Whatu Ora.

Resurfacing works due to start on Thursday 13 November 2025, have been brought forward and are now planned to commence on Tuesday 11 November 2025.

Details: As part of the Marlborough Roads maintenance programme, we will be resurfacing the road at the Spring Creek roundabout and laying new asphalt.

This work will be carried out at night under stop/go management on State Highway 1 with delays of up to 10 minutes. A 30 km/h temporary speed limit will be in place at all times.

During the night works contractors will resurface the start of Ferry Road near the railway lines. This means access to Ferry Road from State Highway 1 will be **closed during work hours of 7pm to 7am**.

Residents must detour via Tuamarina from Blind Creek Road to Thomas Road, Neal Road onto Chaytors Road, Bothams Bend Road and then Ferry Road.

Heavy vehicle access to the Spring Creek industrial area will be maintained via Gouland Road.

Resurfacing work involves removing the existing road surface and repairing the road before applying new asphalt and line marking. This operation involves heavy machinery activity, noise, dust and hot

At times our work may impact access to your property; however, every effort will be made to get the work done as quickly as possible, with minimal disruption. Please contact us if you have specific property access requirements. For the period of resurfacing, parking will be restricted, and any vehicles will need to be removed from the street. If vehicles are parked in the worksite, they will be professionally removed if so required,

Emergency vehicles will be accommodated through the site.

We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause and will keep disruption to a minimum.

All work is subject to weather and other unforeseen circumstances. In the event of unsuitable conditions, work will be rescheduled to the next suitable workday. For confirmation of planned work going ahead, please visit www.journeys.nzta.govt.nz
